

PHASES FOR LIVING SAFELY WITH COVID WITHIN SCHOOLS

Following a large Omicron Variant Outbreak in school-age children during Term One and January 2022, we see a decrease in the number of positive cases in our community. While there continues to be a medium risk in schools, the COVID-19 testing programs in schools and strict adherence to these protocols will be the strongest protections. These protocols will reduce the risk of transmission of the virus in schools as we learn to live with the COVID-19

As these Phases are relaxed, more responsibility will be needed by Schools, School Staff, Parents and Students to be more attentive to prevent exposure that can result in catching COVID.

NOTE: THE ORDER TO QUARANTINE FALLS UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE CMO, NOT THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION. WHILE THESE PHASES ARE TO BE ADHERED TO, ANY POSITIVE CASES/OUTBREAKS IN SCHOOLS AND THE QUARANTINING REQUIREMENT, AS A RESULT, WILL BE DIRECTED BY THE CMO AND ADHERED TO BY ANY PERSON REQUIRED TO QUARANTINE. MASK WEARING AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE IS RECOMMENDED TO REDUCE THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

THESE PROTOCOLS WILL BE REVIEWED REGULARLY, CONSIDERING THE OUTBREAKS IN THE COMMUNITY AND THE VACCINATION STATUS OF STAFF AND STUDENTS. ROUTINE SALIVA SCREENING/LATERAL FLOW TESTING WILL CONTINUE FOR STAFF AND STUDENTS IN ALL SCHOOLS.

 - Around-the-neck, over the-nose masks/ gaiters or masks with vents is not permitted.

Hand Hygiene

- Hands should be washed with soap and water for 20 seconds and dried completely with a single-use paper hand towel.
 - Alternately:
 - > Students under 6 years can use Baby Wipes/Wet Ones.
 - > Students 6 years and older can use an ethanol alcohol-based hand sanitiser.
 - Hands should be sanitised:
 - During entry.
 - > Before eating.
 - > Before and after outdoor play.
 - > During transitions between classroom activities.
 - > After using the bathroom.

Ventilation

- Critical practice is keeping all windows and doors open every day.
- Exceptions are rooms with windows that do not open or during inclement weather.
- > Air-conditioning systems (Recirculating-only systems are not advised) must be enhanced and maintained frequently.

Heaters must be used sparingly while rooms are occupied, as this virus can be more easily transmitted in warmer temperatures and higher humidity.

- Entry into schools requires a self-reported, NEGATIVE HOME LFT RESULT within two days of the event or administering a SELF-SUPPLIED LFT upon arrival observed by the school.
- All in-school staff and therapists/specialist teachers must sign in each day and complete the entry procedures.
- Staff visiting schools to observe files only and not interact with staff or students can visit up to 4 schools per day.
- ❖ Includes Essential Government Therapists/ Services and Approved Community Partners (e.g., oral health, speech therapy, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, Nutrition Services, Child & Family Services, Bermuda Police Service, Menuhin Foundation (indoors and outdoors, with up to 5 students socially distanced with MASK WEARING ENCOURAGED from 1 2 class bubbles, only), I-PLAY Program, The

Reading Clinic Tutors, SunSmart, Bermuda Diabetes Association, National Drug Control, and JAG Athletics) are permitted (as above in point #1 below).

- Students can attend therapeutic sessions at Tomorrow's Voices and Windreach.
- Observations are permitted in the classroom with face masks and physical distancing.
- Students can attend programs at Kaleidoscope, Bermuda Sloop Foundation/Spirit of Bermuda, and Endeavor; and travel on public transportation/in disinfected vehicles, wearing their face masks snugly on the face and over the nose and mouth as possible. All assisting staff and the van/ mini-bus driver must wear face masks.
- Parents' private vehicles can transport students from different households with all wearing masks and windows open if the parents have provided a self-reported, NEGATIVE HOME LFT RESULT within two days of the event or administering a SELF-SUPPLIED LFT upon arrival observed by the school.
- All Government peripatetic/itinerant staff/mentors/specialist teachers/officers/ETAs/ETs/ school counsellors must sign in and complete the entry procedures. All such staff must be compliant with their respective screening testing protocol.
 - > May be delivered remotely.
 - Can visit <u>one</u> school in the morning and one in the afternoon and conduct <u>pull-out</u> sessions with 1 – 2 students from the same class bubble, only (no inclass/push-in sessions).
- Students will not participate in the Work Release Program.
- No Community Partners are permitted to enter schools.

- All Government peripatetic/itinerant staff/mentors/specialist teachers/officers/ETAs/ETs/ school counsellors must sign in and complete the entry procedures at each school. All such staff must be compliant with their respective screening testing protocol.

 - Can visit <u>up to two</u> schools in the morning and <u>up to two</u> schools in the afternoon.

Risk Assessment

Conducted by the School Principal/Point-of-Contact in collaboration with the School Surveillance Team for any positive case connected to the school, following a positive result from a home/certified LFT or certified PCR test.

Notes:

- Protections for schools will continue to be different from those of the general population.
- These are broad risk categories, which may not completely account for all exceptions. Thus, if there is an outbreak in your class, school, or locality, it may be necessary to revert to greater protections of a different phase, temporarily. Each phase is risk-based, and we have taken into consideration many risk factors in the context of local cases, including those in local schools
- Please note: Following the protocols will decrease your risks with broader repercussions e.g., fewer disruptions to learning, wherein an entire year-level/whole school will likely not be affected/quarantined when the Class Bubble Strategy has been adhered to. Also, fewer parents and the wider community would be affected.
